


3rd selection- PRE RD CAMP ZONAL LEVEL

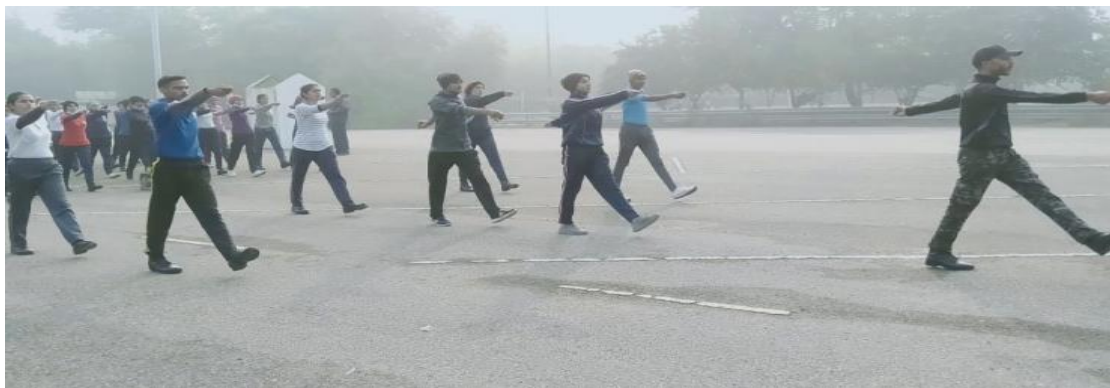

14 January 2021



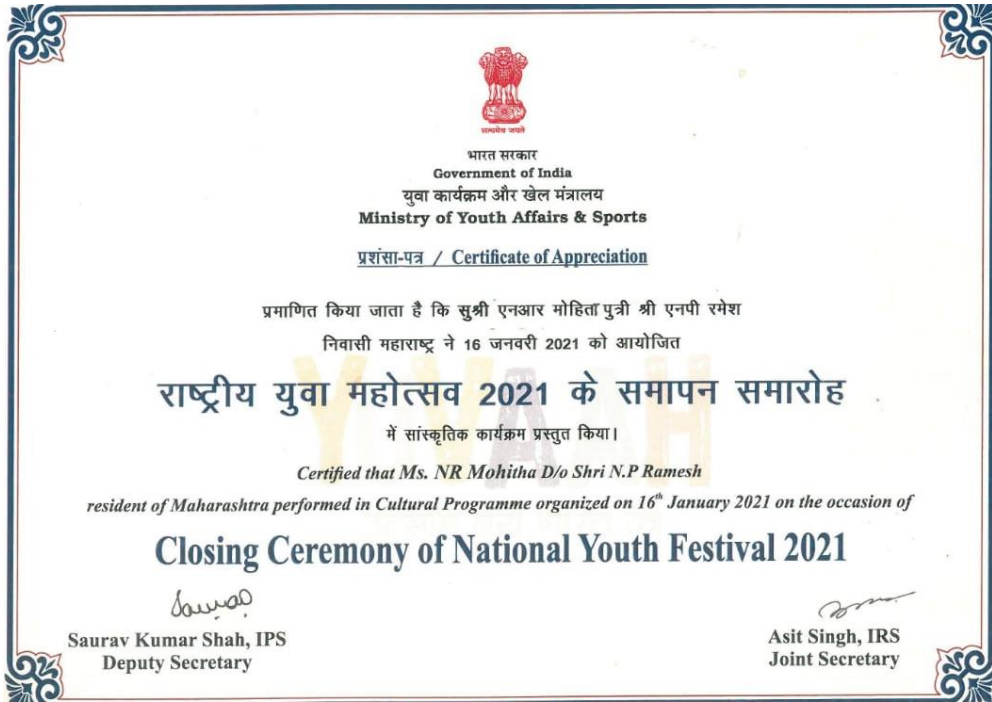

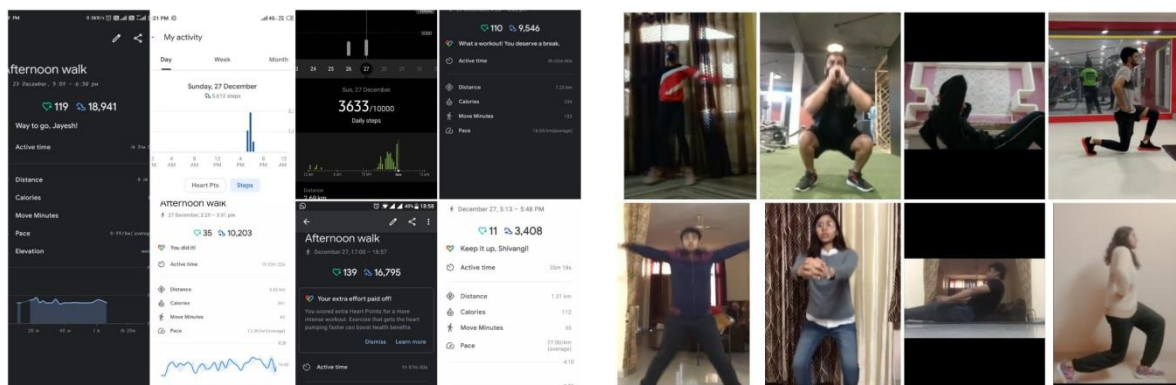
The challenge was divided into two phases:-

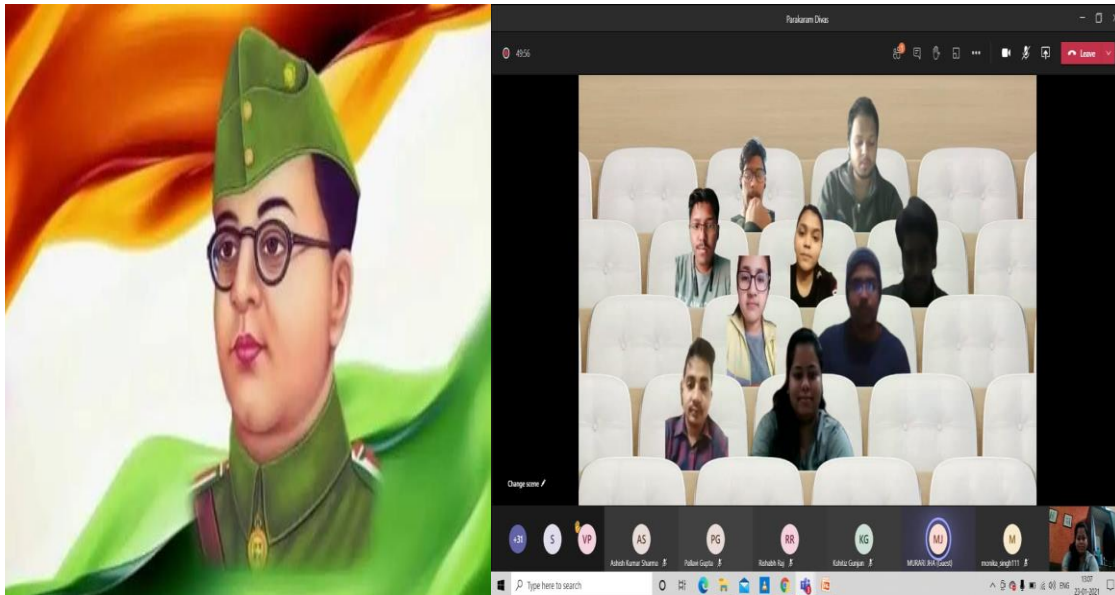

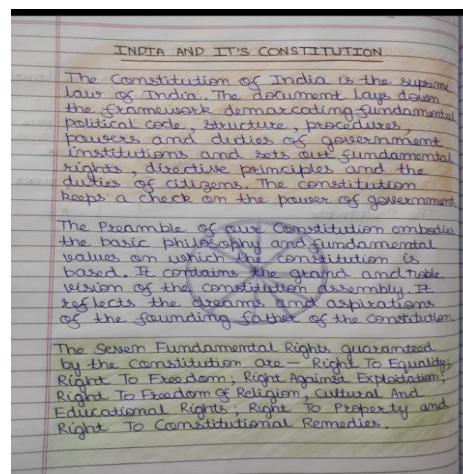
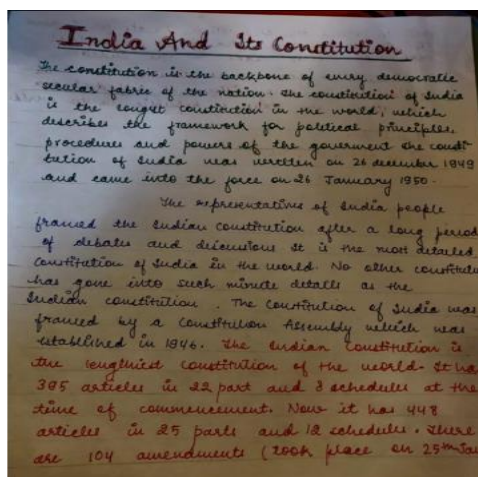

The response from the participants and their parents was overwhelming. The activity was organized and managed well and was a great success.

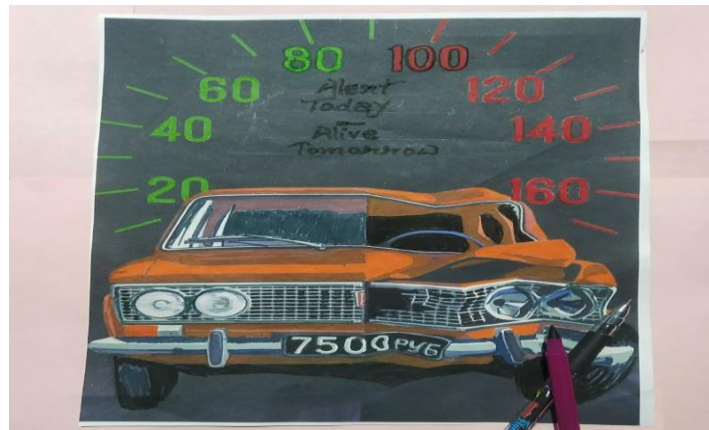

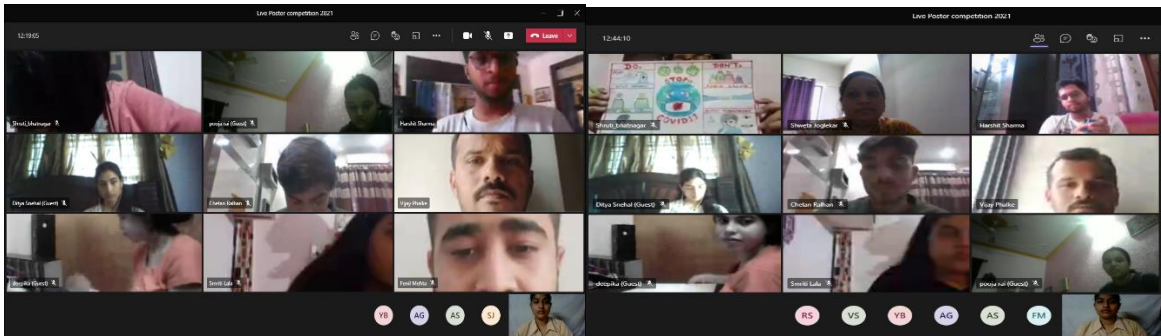
